Royal and Mahiri Team Up For Black History Month 2023

Black History Month is here! Let's talk about how Black History Month started, why Black History is important and some important people we celebrate during Black History Month.

Carter G .Woodson proposed the creation of Negro History Week. In 1970, Black History Month was first celebrated in Ohio. Black History Month became national in 1976. It is in February because two famous people who supported African Americans, Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglass, have birthdays this month.

Black History Month is important because it celebrates Black American men and women who fought for freedom. It reminds us about the past difficulties, struggles and aspirations of African American men and women in history. It teaches us about the problems of suffering because of the look of someone's skin.

Black History is important to us at NHCS because we honor everyone in our community and the differences we each have. We celebrate to show respect in our community. We shouldn't be talking about someone's differences. We shouldn't be disrespectful because of the outside of our bodies. We should respect how we're similar. Let's talk about famous African Americans in history.

One person from Black History we really admire is Bill Russell. Bill Russell was a legend on and off the basketball court. Not only did he have 11 NBA Championships rings, he was part of the Civil Rights Movement and inspired other NBA players, like Kareem Abdul Jabbar, to become activists. In 1961, he refused to play a game in Kentucky because his black teammates couldn't eat at a coffee shop because of segregation. In 1963, he marched with Martin Luther King Jr on the March on Washington. Also in 1963, he led a march from Roxbury to Boston Common to support MLK's work in Birmingham, Alabama. It was the largest civil rights demonstration in the history of Boston at that time with a total of 10,000 marchers. In 2011 he was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Obama for his lifelong work against racism.

Another person from Black History we really admire is Jackie Robinson. Jackie Robinson was the first Black person to ever play in Major League Baseball. When he first joined the League many White players did not want to play with him. Many White baseball fans didn't like the idea of Black players and White players on the same team. People were so angry they threatened him!

Jackie Robinson stood up for himself by proving people wrong and by becoming one of the greatest baseball players of all time. He showed that everyone can play baseball together. He showed that the color of your skin does not matter.

Jeremiah Jumps Back to Lunar New Year

Last month was the Lunar New Year. The Lunar New Year has been celebrated for over 3,500 years. The Lunar New Year might have originated long ago in China during the Shang Dynasty (1600 - 1046 BC) to honor gods and ancestors.

Have you ever made a volcano? This is something you can make in your backyard if you are ever bored at home and have nothing to do. Go outside, get some air and make a volcano with your friends, parents, and family! This is fun and exciting because you get to watch it erupt into the sky!

Ask one of your family members to take you to the grocery store and get the following: white vinegar, baking soda, red food coloring (or other color you would like). You will also need foil, dish soap, a spoon, and some sand. You also need an empty bottle, like a big soda bottle.

Step one - place an empty plastic bottle in a mound of sand outside. Make sure to wash the bottle first!

Step two - use a funnel to add a mix of ½ cup baking soda and ½ cup water into the bottle. This should first be mixed as a slurry before putting it inside.

Step three - mix some food coloring and ½ cup of vinegar together. Pour this mixture inside the bottle.
